This competition is to find the tastiest steak and the most delicious and attractive burger, therefore greater emphasis will be given to the taste and appearance of the product, rather than technical marks for construction.

Notes:

1 - Each steak entry is to be 8oz of steak, sent raw.

2 - Each burger entry is to be a total weight of 8oz and must comprise of at least two burgers (i.e. 4oz each).

3 - The entries will be blind judged and tasted.

4 - Packaging is not vital but will be judged if there is a joint winner.

5 - The first and second prize winners in each class will be put forward to the Championship to find the overall Champion and Reserve Champion Steak/Burger.

Royal Smithfield Club Beef Ribs & Saddle of Lamb Competition

Entries close Tuesday 12th October - late entries will not be accepted

Judging will take place early on Wednesday 3rd November and the entries will be displayed, with prizes, after judging has been completed, for the duration of the event.

Prizes

Champion £40, Reserve Champion £30, Third £15, Fourth £8 Rosette and prize card to all placed entries.

Purchasers/Abattoirs will receive the rosette (if applicable) displayed on the entry at the event.

Beef Ribs

Class 57 Beef Ribs from steer or heifer, any breed or cross

Maximum whole carcase cold weight 380kg No age limit (other than 30 month rule, unless amended or rescinded)

Slaughter - the abattoir to slaughter the animal approximately 8-10 days prior to the event.

Preparation of Entry - the abattoir to butcher the carcase so as to present the Primal Cut. A four-bone rib cut from a nine bone forequarter. Ribs to be taken from the left hand quarter (viewing live animal from rear; right of carcase when hung). Rib length no less than 2" and not more than 4" from edge of eye muscle.

Saddle of Lamb

Class 58 Lamb Carcase, any breed or cross

Maximum whole carcase cold weight 23kg Slaughter - the abattoir to slaughter the animal 5-7 days prior to the event.

Preparation of entry - the abattoir to butcher the carcase so as to present the Primal Cut. Full Saddle. Cutting 6th rib from forequarter to the chump. Leaving the kidney nob in. Breast off.

Notes for Exhibitors

The Organiser reserves the right to:

- •Limit the number of entries in the event of excessive entries being received.
- •Lightly trim the entry for presentation.
- •Reject any entry on the grounds of poor quality.
- •Reject any entry on the grounds of temperature exceeding 5'C on delivery.
- •Rule on any matter not covered within the schedule.
- •Cancel the competition at any time if demanded by the prevailing circumstances.

Participating Abattoirs - Exhibitors may use their own choice of abattoir on condition that the Exhibitor confirms directly with the abattoir that they are willing to handle the competition entry under the following rules:

1. **Arrangements** - Slaughter and sale of the whole carcase is under normal commercial arrangements between the exhibitor and abattoir.

2. Live Animal Delivery - The abattoir to take delivery of the live animal on a day, and at a time, to be agreed with the Exhibitor.

3. **Information** - The abattoir to notify the Organiser of the details of the entry (sex, breed, whole carcase weight and date of birth (beef entries only)) by 5pm on slaughter day.

4. **Identification** - The abattoir to identify the Primal Cut with a label giving the entry catalogue number, as notified by the Organiser on the entry information form provided, prior to delivery.

5. **Delivery of Entry** - The abattoir to arrange delivery of the entry to the competition stand at Agrifest South West, Westpoint, Exeter, EX5 1DJ by 6pm on Tuesday 2nd November.

6. **Butcher/Delivery/Collection** - If a person (other than the nominated abattoir) is preparing the primal cut and/or delivering/collecting the entry, the Exhibitor must inform the Organiser to ensure the correct information/passes are sent out.

7. **Beef Rib Cookery** - Should facilities at the event permit, a cookery tasting assessment may take place and a rib from the Champion and Reserve Champion entries will be non-returnable. The abattoir will be reimbursed at a price per kilo based upon the maximum figures shown in the latest edition of The Meat Trades Journal.

8. **Sale of Entries** - The abattoir to notify the Organiser by 5pm on slaughter day if they wish the entry to be sold on their behalf with the proceeds donated to charity or if the wish to arrange collection of the entry by 5pm on Wednesday 3rd November.

9. Non Collection - Any entries not collected by 5pm on Wednesday will be disposed of with any proceeds donated to charity. The abattoir will be responsible for paying the Exhibitor for the entry.

Rules & Regulations

General Rules

- 1. **ENTRIES** Cattle and lambs may only be entered in one class with the exception of the Young Farmers class.
- 2. CLOSING DATE Entries close strictly on Friday 8th October.
- **3. SUBSTITUTIONS** Substitutions will be permitted up until Friday 15th October.
- 4. ENTRY FEES Full entry fee must accompany the entry.
- 5. **REFUNDS** Refunds of 50% of the entry fee will be available up until 15th October, thereafter no refunds will be made.
- **6. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES** The Devon County Agricultural Association reserves the right to refuse entry for whatever reason.
- ARRIVAL All livestock must arrive between 10:00hrs and 16:00hrs on Tuesday 2nd November and remain in their stalls until 16:00hrs on Wednesday 3rd November.
- **8. WEIGHING** Weighing of cattle and lambs will take place between 12:00hrs and 18:00hrs on Tuesday 2nd November.
- 9. STRAW A limited amount of straw will be provided.
- **10. VEHICLES** All non exhibition items and cars must be off site by 08:00hrs on Wednesday 3rd November.
- **11. ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT** All electrical equipment used on site must be PAT tested within the last 12 months.
- 12. PASSES Exhibitors must display correct passes at all times, failure to do so will result in admission fees being charged.
- **13. SMOKING** Smoking and e-cigarettes are not permitted inside the Westpoint building.
- 14. DOGS Dogs are not permitted inside the Westpoint building.
- **15. DISEASE** Animals suspected of suffering from disease must be reported to a Steward. They may be required to be removed from the Show immediately or placed into an isolation unit if, In the opinion of the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon, they are not fit or safe to be exhibited. Such animals will not be permitted to compete.
- **16. VETERINARY CHARGES** Any veterinary expenses incurred at the event must be borne by the exhibitor.
- **17. MOBILE PHONES** The use of mobile phones is not permitted by exhibitors whilst they are leading or showing stock anywhere on site.
- 18. CLASSES The Devon County Agricultural Association reserve the right to split or amalgamate classes as entries warrant. Any animal not forward at the time of judging will not be judged, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure each exhibit is present in the Show Ring at the appropriate time.
- **19. CLOTHING** Exhibitors are required to wear white coats and suitable footwear when exhibiting stock.
- 20. OBJECTIONS Objections must be made in writing and delivered to the Livestock Office accompanied by a deposit of £50 in cash, which shall be forfeited if the objection is decided to be unfounded by the Devon County Agricultural

Association.

- **21. LIABILITY** Neither the Devon County Agricultural Association, nor any of its Officers or Servants, shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen from any infectious or contagious disease, or any other cause, or circumstance whatever to Exhibitors or their Servants, or to any animal or article exhibited or property brought onto the Showground; or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of or attributable to, Agrifest South West, or these or any other conditions or regulations described in relation thereto; each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him, including any infectious or contagious disease, and shall indemnify the Devon County Agricultural Association against all legal or other proceedings in regard hereto.
- **22. INSURANCE** All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover of a suggested minimum of £5 million.
- FORCE MAJEURE If an event defined hereafter as Force Majeure occurs the DCAA 23. will not be responsible for the financial consequences or any losses or any actions claims or demands caused to or made by an exhibitor or their servants or agents caused by the failure of Agrifest South West to be held but for the event of Force Majeure on which it would otherwise to be held. Force Majeure means for the purposes of this clause exceptionally inclement weather; flooding of the whole or any part of the Devon County Showground or the whole or any part of the car parks associated with it; an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster; act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgment, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by DCAA to run Agrifest South West; breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of DCAA.

Cattle Rules

- **1. TB TESTING** All cattle must be pre movement tested for TB and comply with any standstill requirements.
- 2. CATTLE ENTRIES Overall cattle numbers may be limited, entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis and may be limited to four per exhibitor with a maximum of two entries per class per exhibitor.
- 4. HANDLING All cattle must be halter led.
- 5. **PASSPORTS** All cattle passports and movement forms must be handed in at the Livestock Office on arrival.

6. **RESTRAINTS** - Exhibitors must be satisfied in all cases, and at all times, that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers and where appropriate heifers should be trained to accept "bulldogs" as a restraint. All cattle must be secured to the satisfaction of the Stewards, who shall have the power to exclude from the Showground any vicious or unruly animal.

Sheep Rules

- 1. RAM LAMBS Ram lambs are not permitted in the prime lamb classes.
- 2. **COLOURING** Sheep should be shown according to their respective Breed Society rules.
- 3. DOCKING The Mutilation (Permitted Procedures) (England) Regulations 2007 Schedule 5.5 - In all cases sheep must have enough of the tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of the male sheep. Any sheep which do not comply with the aforementioned legislation will not be eligible to be shown in the Ring.
- 4. TRIMMING Lambs in any class may be trimmed, untrimmed or shorn.
- 5. MV ACCREDITATION Lambs may be MV or Non MV, separate penning available.
- 6. ENTRIES Exhibitors may enter a maximum of two pairs per class.
