

SMITHFIELD FORUM - UPDATE

The Forum has definitely had a significant impact on the Industry, continuing to challenge and drive the benefits of joined-up working across the sector. The impact of Covid-19 has and will continue to change how we work as we come to terms with the pandemic. The loss of the Re-Think Conference was unfortunate given the resounding support it had achieved. - Life Member. £975. Membership for the lifetime of the named individual. Benefits as per Full Member: attendance and voting at the Annual Members' Meeting; right to stand for election to Board of Trustees; attendance at Members Country Meeting; quarterly newsletter; reduced entry fee for Club competitions.
- Corporate Member. £750pa. Corporate stakeholder organisations are invited to apply for Membership nominating an individual staff or Board member to be part of the Smithfield Forum - a united voice for the British red meat supply chain. Further benefits are: attendance and voting at Annual Members' Meeting; attendance at Members Country Meeting; quarterly Newsletter.
- Independent Member. £95pa. As above (Corporate Member) but aimed at individuals within the red meat industry who wish to be involved in the Smithfield Forum. Or for Corporate Members who wish an additional member of staff to join.
- Youth Member. £30pa. Up to and including 28 years of age. Benefits include: attendance and voting at the Annual Members' Meeting; right to stand for election to Board of Trustees; attendance at Members Country Meeting; quarterly newsletter; reduced entry fee for Club competitions.
